#### **Annual Coaching Licences**

- Mandatory Annual Licence: July 1 June 30 FREE
- For any coach who coaches more than 7 hours in a year
- Ontario had 463 licence holders (342 in 2018, 380 in 2017)

#### Commit to Kids

- 20 purchased licences for Commit to Kids training were used up by club members
- Many clubs are reaching out for help to implement safe sport guidelines
- Ontario Safe Sport Task Force: Through expert and stakeholder consultations, the Ontario Safe Sport Task Force (OSSTF) was responsible for producing recommendations for a harmonized, sustainable and scalable safe sport strategy and approach for the Ontario sport system to implement.
- Nordiq Canada SSGEIS (Safety in Sport and Gender Equity Implementation Strategy): build on existing initiatives, policies and practices and engage in a Safety in Sport and Gender Equity Implementation Strategy (SSGEIS). The SSGEIS will be developed and eventually implemented with the national team as well as our 350 clubs through our 13 provincial and territorial Divisions across Canada."
