#### **Ontario Winter Games Selection**

# Olympic Stream Athletes:

Each District will select a minimum of 20 athletes (10 males and 10 females); the remaining 40 spots will be allocated based proportionately on Nordiq Canada license holders while maintaining gender equity.

If using selection races, races must be completed by December 31, 2023 which will allow for Games registration deadline of January 7, 2023. Exceptions to this will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

- 1. Each District is guaranteed a team size of up to 20 athletes (10 males and 10 females) for a total of 80 athletes.
- 2. Districts may choose to nominate less than their allocated positions. Remaining positions will be re-assigned equally amongst the remaining Districts.



- 3. The remaining positions shall be divided amongst the 4 Districts: LSSD, SOD, NCD and NOD as per the following:
- a. Districts shall be allocated a number of positions based on the proportion of the number of Nordiq Canada race licenses held by YOB 2008 to YOB 2010 athletes (both male & female) registered with an ON club (within that district) divided by the total number of licenses in the identified YOBs (male and female) in the province.
- Gender equality must be maintained. Any issues of gender inequality within a District allocation will be dealt with on a case by case basis
- 4. All Districts must submit a ranking list of 10 or more per gender to <a href="mailto:admin@xcskiontario.ca">admin@xcskiontario.ca</a> at the very latest by December 31, 2023. Early submissions are strongly encouraged to facilitate the registration process. Exceptions to this will be evaluated on a case by case basis.
  - a. The first 10 males and 10 females will be named to the OWG Games Team  $(4 \times 20 \text{ per District} = 80 \text{ total}).$
  - b. The next 40 athletes will be selected by proportionate Nordiq Canada license holders as of December 1, 2023.

Please note: Districts must submit a ranking list with more than 10 males and 10 females so that District allocation can be facilitated by XCSO. XCSO will go down the ranking list according



to Nordiq Canada license holder's allocations while maintaining equal genders.

#### <u>Paralympic Stream</u> Athletes:

The selection race will be at the Candy Cane Cup at Nakkertok on Sunday, December 17, 2023.

The top 5 para nordic athletes by gender will be selected for the team. Selection will endeavor to have equal representation from both sitting and standing athletes, and by gender. A maximum of 10 athletes will be selected to attend the Ontario Winter Games.

If an athlete is unable to attend the qualifying race due to conflict or illness, they may be eligible for a spot on the team, if additional spots are available. These athletes must apply with justification by sending an expression of interest along with their intended race schedule for the 2023-2024 season by email to <a href="mailto:para@xcskiontario.ca">para@xcskiontario.ca</a> no later than December 17, 2023.

#### **Athlete Eligibility**

All athletes must be Nordiq Canada licensed with a registered Ontario club. It is recommended that athletes obtain their license early in the season in order to gain full benefit including CPL for seeding purposes and Ontario points for ON team selection.

A Nordiq Canada guide license must be purchased for VI athletes Pay the registration fee which includes race registration, accommodations, food, and some OWG related ground transportation as per OWG policy (See appendix A).

All athletes and guides 14 and older must complete the Coaches Association of Canada SafeSport and Rule of Two training modules as required by the XCSO's SafeSport Policies (Screening Policy).

It is the responsibility of each OWG District Team Manager to confirm that all screening requirements are met.

#### **Registration Fee**

The registration fee is TBD from Ministry.



#### **Coach Eligibility**

All coaches must be a minimum Learn to Train or Level 2. There is no fee for coaches/team managers, however, registration is required. All coaches/team managers/support personnel must complete the CAC Safe Sport Module and the Rule of Two Module

All coaches must be in compliance with XCSO's SafeSport Policies (Screening Policy).

It is the responsibility of each OWG District Team Manager to confirm that all screening requirements are met.

#### **Force Majeure**

Subject to the appeal process below, athlete selection to the OWG's will consider "Force Majeure" appeals, as follows:

Injury, illness, family misfortune, exceptional circumstances and equipment breakage will be considered valid grounds for appeal. Appeals must be in writing and include supporting documentation to support the appeal – including Doctor's notes. Appeals will be evaluated by the HPC taking into consideration the reason for the appeal.

Force majeur appeals will not be allowed beyond the registration deadline of Jan 7, 2023.

Any force majeure appeal selections approved by a subcommittee of HPC will be included within the identified quota of athletes by category and gender.

#### **Funding**

130 athletes (120 Olympic stream & 10 Paralympic stream) and 32 coaches/wax techs/managers (22 Olympic stream & 8 Paralympic stream) will be eligible for travel funding as per OWG Travel Subsidy.

Accommodation will be provided for all games participants on Friday, February 16 and Saturday, February 17 only.



Transportation will be provided to/from race venue for games participants only.

Meals may be provided for games participants only

Ontario Winter Games Travel subsidy is available to participants who live more than 300 km from the host community of Thunder Bay.

Flights must be booked using the Games' travel agent. Details TBD. All flights regardless of origin will cost no more than \$800 per participant. Ontario Winter Games will subsidize \$250 per flight per participant.

#### Funding for club coaches/managers (32)

Each District will have funding for a minimum of 4 coaches/managers with a minimum of 1 male and 1 female coach/manager for a total of 16 coaches/managers named.

The remaining coaches (8) will be named according to the number of athletes per club at a 5:1 ratio selected to attend the OWG as per allocation of Nordiq Canada license holders (see table above)

8 coaches/managers for the Paralympic stream athletes.

#### **Ontario Cup and Ontario Leader Incentive**

For Olympic Stream athletes, Ontario Winter Games races count towards the 7 OCUP starts required for Ontario Junior Ski Team (OJST) eligibility, and contribute to the Ontario Leader Incentive Program as outlined in the <a href="Ontario Excellence Programs">Ontario Excellence Programs</a> document.



# Appendix A - Common Wax Protocol and Ski Preparation Process

Skate Technique Qualifier Race 2024 Ontario Winter Games- Thunder Bay, Ontario February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Cross Country Ski Ontario will support a common non-fluoro wax Skate Technique Qualifier race at the 2024 Ontario Winter Games to be held February 17<sup>th</sup> in Thunder Bay, Ontario. The aim of introducing common wax for everyone is to help make cross-country skiing more fair and equitable. This concept has been trialed successfully on the World Cup circuit in Tallin, 2023.

#### **XCSO Responsibilities**

- Provide the wax of the day
- Provide base cleaner
- Provide shop towels, sharpies, stickers

#### **District Coach Responsibilities**

Each district coach will be responsible for:

- Assuming a position in the wax room production line
- Sharing wax room equipment (wax bench, nylon brush, ski racks, cleaning brush)
- Attend pre-games meeting to review protocol and assign roles

#### **Athlete Responsibilities**

- Athletes will be responsible for delivering one pair of race skis to the wax
  preparation trailer 60 min prior to their qualifier start time. Only one pair of skis per
  athlete will be waxed for racing.
- Skiers must present with their bib number

Athlete's Start Time – 60 min = Athlete's Arrival Time (with race skis) at the designated Wax Room

• Athletes will receive race skis at the start area 30 min prior to qualifier start and may warm up using their race skis.



• Athletes are still responsible for allowing ample time to pick up timing chips (if they are used)

Athletes retain control of their skis after qualifier. XCSO respectfully requests that no re-waxing of skis occurs for the relay competition.
